

A message from the Director

I first heard about Therese Tabb's book, Occupation Memories, because my husband Chris was hosting a presentation by some of the contributors at the Opera House Studio. The people who spoke were a collection of locals who I am sure I would have passed in the street at some point; but who would have thought that ordinary Jersey men and women like these would have such fascinating childhood stories to tell?



During that afternoon, I watched as these old people became young again, recounting stories of adventure and mischief under the watchful eyes of the Germans.

When my friend Karen Forbes told me that she was using Therese's book as inspiration for this play, I felt privileged to be its director. It has given me the chance to work with very talented adult performers. Usually, as the Head of Drama at JCG, I work with children all day so directing adults promised to be an exciting change.
